FOUR TONES: 1 – High Level = first tone ex. – **mā** mother
 2 – Rising = second tone ex. – **má** hemp
 3 – Falling Rising = third tone ex. – **mǎ** horse
 4 – Falling = fourth tone ex. – **mà** scold
